Mission:

The Publications Committee oversees the Society's publications, including the *Journal of Mammalogy*, *Mammalian Species*, and Special Publications. The Committee sets editorial policy for the Society and nominates editors for approval by the Board of Directors. The Committee is typically composed of current editors, who are involved in reviewing and accepting papers and the technical production of the publications.

Information Items:

(1) Compared to recent years, it was a relatively quiet year for the Publications Committee! Highlights of activities of the Publication Committee included (a) working to assure smooth transitions of Editors for both ASM serials (it was); (b) completion of full electronic availability of archival and current ASM serials to all members at ASM's Web site when *Mammalian Species* became available in JSTOR in October 2006; (c) final review and editing of the Animal Care and Use Guidelines, which will be published in the June 2007 issue of the *Journal*, distributed to IACUCs throughout the country compliments of the University of New Mexico, and available Open Access at ASM silo site and BioOne; (d) assisting President Timm with ASM's formal endorsement of Elbroch's "Animal Skulls: A Guide to North American Species"; (e) working to assure that AllenTrack for *Mammalian Species* will be fully functional in 2007; (f) publication of an overview of ASM's response to the digital age in the April 2007 issue of the Journal of Mammalogy; and (g) Leslie represented ASM at 3 workshops on data registries/centers sponsored by the Ecological Society of America and the National Science Foundation in July 2006 (Washington, D.C.), December 2006 (Santa Barbara, CA), and May 2007 (Durham, NC; all travel costs paid by ESA); for example of topics covered see:

Action Items:

- (1) New Editors: The Committee will seek Board approval of 2 new Associate Editors for the *Journal of Mammalogy* (nominations still being considered as of 20 April 2007).
- (2) The Committee proposes to increase the number of Associate Editors for the *Journal of Mammalogy* from 16 to 20; if approved the Committee's budget will need to be increased by \$4,000 to cover honoraria.
- (3) In light of current declines in institutional subscriptions, consider increasing members dues from \$45 regular and \$35 student to \$50 regular and \$40 student but hold online membership at \$30 regular and \$20 developing country.


